**FACE COVERINGS REQUIRED AT ALL MASSES**

### Feast Days

October is the Feast of the Holy Rosary. It was instituted as thanksgiving for Christian Victory at the Battle of Lepanto 1571, which saved Europe from the Turks. Even Elizabeth I of England instructed that church bells should peal to mark the victory.

- 11th Oct Pope St John XXIII
- 12th October St Wilfrid of York, Bishop and Missionary
- 14th October Pope St Callistus
- 15th October St Teresa of Avila
- 16th October St Margaret Mary Alacoque, Virgin who worked to spread devotion to the Sacred Heart
- 17th October St Ignatius of Antioch, Bishop, Martyr
- 18th St Luke the Evangelist

**Prisoners' Sunday - this year on 11th October** - is the national day of prayer and action for prisoners and their dependants as marked by the Catholic Church and across the Christian denominations. It is a day to direct our thoughts and prayers to prisoners, their families and children. Prisoners' Sunday is the time to reflect on how we as individuals, as a Church and as a community are serving those affected by imprisonment. Prisoners' Sunday marks the first day of the ecumenical Prisons Week, a week of prayer which raises awareness of issues faced by those affected by the criminal justice system.

### A reminder to our Eucharistic Ministers and Readers about the advice from the Bishops' Conference.

Readers should sanitise their hands before and after reading, or be supplied with single-use gloves, and should avoid touching the microphones or the Lectionary during the Liturgy of the Word, apart from page turning. Readers may remove their face coverings at the lectern to read and should replace them before stepping away from it providing the lectern is sufficiently distant from the congregation.

Once the priest has received Holy Communion, he should put on his face covering and cleanse his hands with alcohol sanitiser before opening the pre-prepared ciborium for the Communion of the people. If there is a deacon assisting, or any other Minister of Holy Communion, they should similarly cleanse their hands and then receive communion from the priest from the people's ciborium, and under one kind only. They should then put on their face coverings and cleanse their hands again (or put on the single use glove) before receiving their ciborium from which they remove the covering or pall if it is still in place.

Gloves and sanitiser will be available in the porch or near the lectern.
