**Statement from Father Jim:** Whilst regretting the ban on collective worship, the Bishop's call for us to come and pray at the times allowed for private prayer is welcome. St Anne's will be open for private prayer weekdays during daylight hours. We already know there are people with Covid-19 in our communities and the vulnerable need to be protected. We can't afford to be complacent. Below is the statement from the Catholic Bishops' Conference. On Wednesday Parliament passed into law the Regulations governing many aspects of activity in the whole of England until Wednesday, 2 December.

"These Regulations prohibit the gathering of people for communal worship in churches and other religious buildings. Despite profound misgivings it is important that we, as responsible citizens, observe these Regulations, which have the force of law."

**First Holy Communion:** The Holy Communion preparation has been suspended at church. Mrs Holden will prepare all candidates within school adhering to COVID safety regulations. The date for receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation has been cancelled due to lockdown. The original date of First Holy Communion (19/20 Dec) will be reviewed nearer the time. If places of worship have been opened by then, Fr Jim would like the children to make their First Holy Communion on the original date.

**Last Tuesday, the Independent Inquiry into Child Abuse (IICSA),** published its report into the Catholic Church in England and Wales. Whilst the Church with its different dioceses and religious orders is the focus of the report, our hearts go out to anyone who has suffered abuse in a Church setting. Such acts represent a gross breach of trust and are truly reprehensible. We acknowledge that victims and survivors have usually endured years of pain, made worse by the failures to listen and respond to their voices. We anticipate the report will make many recommendations to the Church. The Bishops and the institutes of consecrated life and societies of apostolic life in England and Wales have already commissioned an independent review of our Catholic safeguarding arrangements, especially at national level. This has been undertaken under the leadership of Ian Elliot, a renowned safeguarding consultant. His report is also due to be published soon.
