Organ Recital at St Walburnee's Church:

As part of the concerted fundraising efforts, alongside a bid for Heritage Lottery Funding, towards the costs of restoring the iconic St Walburge's Church, Preston, an organ recital will be held in the church on the evening of **Saturday 21 August** between **6.30pm and approximately 8.30pm**.

The programme will be a colourful collection of baroque and early classical works from Germany and Austria, featuring legendary composers, Johann Sebastian Bach and Joseph Haydn.

The recital will be by accomplished organist, Sean Maxwell, an American currently based in Austria and the church will be a magnificent backdrop to enjoy the compositions of such wonderful musicians - this event will be the only one of its kind in the North West.
