Bishops of England and Wales Statement: During the height of the pandemic and restrictions on public worship, people explored other ways to practice their faith, including Spiritual Communion via live streaming. As people begin returning to more regular patterns of parish life and following the first face to face meeting in Leeds, the Catholic Bishops' of England and Wales have issued a statement about the importance of honouring Sunday.

The Bishops of England and Wales are now encouraging all Catholics to look again at the patterns which they have formed in recent months with regard to going to Mass on Sundays.

The Sunday Eucharist is a gift; as God's holy people we are called to praise and thank God in the most sublime way possible. When the Church speaks of the Sunday obligation, it reminds us that attending Mass is a personal response to the selfless offering of Christ's love.
