Parish Outing: We are organising a parish outing to Stonyhurst (Jesuit) College in the Ribble Valley on the 22nd August. The tour will commence at 2pm and last about 90 minutes. Stonyhurst has its origins at St Omer in 1593, then at Bruges and Liege, producing a number of English martyrs, including Blessed William Harcourt SJ of Weeton. By the end of 18th century, following upheavals in France, it had relocated to Stonyhurst. The cost of the tour is £15 and will, hopefully, include the museum. If interested, there is a form in the porch for your name and contact details.

Dedication of the Altar (8): When the altar has been anointed and incensed it then prepared for the celebration of the first Mass on it. It is first cleaned then covered in 3 cloths representing the 3 cloths that covered the body of Jesus in the tomb (the altar being a sign of Christ). Candles and a crucifix are arranged on it. The light of the candles represents the presence of the God and the joy of the Eucharistic celebration. When the Bishop celebrates seven candles should be lit as a sign of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit and the fullness of spiritual power granted to the Bishop. The crucifix always stands on the altar to remind us that in the Mass the sacrifice of Calvary is renewed. When the altar is prepared the Bishop proceeds to kiss it for the first time in order to reverence this place made holy by the rite of consecration for the celebration of the mysteries of our redemption. Mass is then celebrated there for the first time. This is the principal act that consecrates the altar when it is reserved henceforth for the worship of God.
