The Word of God for 27th Sunday.
He may be gone (on hols!) but he can still write to you!. First of all
thank you to Fr Philip and Fr Tom for offering the Masses
and Sacraments for us. Indeed we are grateful.

So to the Word for this Sunday. As ever there is much to reflect upon.
The first reading for today if read in Holy Family parish in Gaza City
or in several places in the Ukraine, will resonate to the core of people
going through severe adversity. The prophet Habakkuk lived around
600BC, just before the people of Israel were deported to
Babylon. His writing is counted among the twelve minor prophets
of the Old Testament. His words are encouragements to believe in
the transforming power of faith. Often our own lives today need this
consolation. These words today could be written to us.

The Second reading is again about belief in the power of faith to
make a difference in everyday life. St Paul seems to imply that his
missionary companion Timothy might be suffering from a certain
timidity.(Paul appointed him as the first Bishop of Ephesus)
The Gospel extract today reminds us of the zeal of the Apostles as
they invite the Lord to increase their faith.

Again a quality from which we all could benefit. Let's enter more fully
the life of the Holy Eucharist and invite the Lord to strengthen our
Faith. Amen.
